Avoiding the Trap of Fall's Busyness

The "lazy" days of summer have given way to the crispy cool weather of fall, with corn mazes, back to school, fourth quarter planning and thoughts like "where did the year go? It's almost over!" It's easy to let life speed up and spin nearly out of control with to-do lists and holiday busyness. Some of these activities are welcome, and some … not so much.

You're no doubt familiar with the story of sisters Mary and Martha told in Luke 10:38-42. There is a lot of work to do, and Martha is busy taking care of it. But Mary is sitting calmly at the feet of Jesus, listening to Him teach. I've often had teachers ask, "Are you being Mary or Martha?" But I don't think it's as simple as that. The lesson, I believe, is to focus our hearts on Jesus as we also go about our work and activities. Another cliché that takes its turn in Christian circles is: if the devil can't make you sin, he'll make you busy.
